Tim had many friends throughout the community by whom he will be remembered





US 31 UPDATE

The 146th Street bridge will be completed this spring. Tree clearing is in progress from South Rangeline to Greyhound Pass. Beginning this spring, INDOT will demolish around 40 structures in preparation for the next segment of work and begin construction of US 31 from south of Rangeline Road to Greyhound Pass. 


