

Westfield City Council March 12, 2012

The Westfield City Council met in regular session Monday March 12, 2012 at the Westfield City Hall. Members present were Jim Ake, John Dippel, Steve Hoover, Bob Horkay, Bob Smith, Cindy Spoljaric and Rob Stokes. Also present were Mayor Andy Cook, Deputy Clerk-Treasurer Teresa Skelton and Legal Counsel Matthew Strzynski with Krieg DeVault, Law Firm, LLP.

President Horkay called the meeting to order at 7:05P.M. There will be two changes on the Agenda. Ordinance 12-05 and Ordinance 12-06 have been moved to April.

Approval of Minutes:

Rob Stokes made the motion to approve February 27, 2012 as presented. Steve Hoover seconded. Vote: Yes-7; No-0. Motion carried.

Cindy Spoljaric had a question on two wastewater invoices that were in the same amount. Director of Public Works Kurt Wanninger thanked the Council and Finance Committee for reworking the rate structure for both Water and Wastewater Rate Adjustment Ordinances for consideration.

Cindy Spoljaric suggested that the summer sewer savings be extended by two months. This would make the eligible time for the adjustment be from May through October. She also would like to see a conservation effort for the future with volunteer input and education. Steve Hoover agreed with these two suggestions. He also explained that without these increases our citizens could be negatively affected.
