Amendment                      Town of Westfield Road Impact Fee rate structure.

Mr. Kurt Wanninger, Westfield Public Works, introduced Matt Miller, HNTB, and presented the details of the Road Impact Fee Rate Structure. He stated the main reason for this ordinance is that the Westfield Public Works Department reassesses the needs of the community every two years to determine what the level of service is on the roads and to determine what supporting road impact fees will support the construction and development of those roads.

Miller gave a brief overview of the study to update the impact fee.

A Public Hearing opened at 10:00 p.m.

Ms. Angie Gidley, B.A.G.I., expressed concern regarding the west side of US 31 and the economic development impact and asked whether developers are able to due credits in lieu of impact fees.

The Public Hearing closed at 10:02 p.m.

Kingshill moved to forward the amended Road Impact Fee Rate Structure to the Town Council with a positive recommendation not to exceed the amount proposed in the study.

Del Greco seconded, and the motion passed 7-0-1 (Kelleher).
