FILINGS OF NOTE

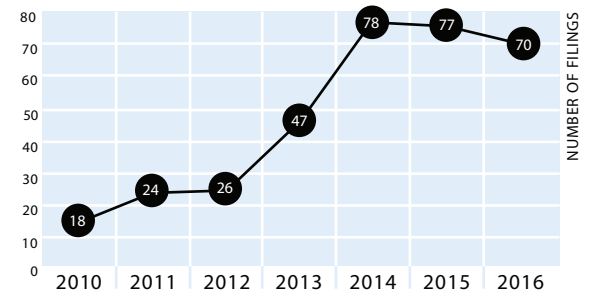
- IU Health, a 9,800 SF medical office building, received approval of its Detailed Development Plan, located in the Spring Mill Station SEC PUD District.
- Westfield Business Center, a 132,000 SF light industrial spec building, received approval of its Detailed Development Plan, located on Oak Ridge Road just north of 169th Street, see rendering below.
- Oak Trace and Washington Woods Elementary Schools received approval of their Detailed Development Plans to accommodate 14,900 SF expansions.
- The Junction Sub-District Addendum, an amendment to the Westfield-Washington Township Comprehensive Plan was adopted by Council. This addendum further clarifies the vision for development in downtown Westfield.



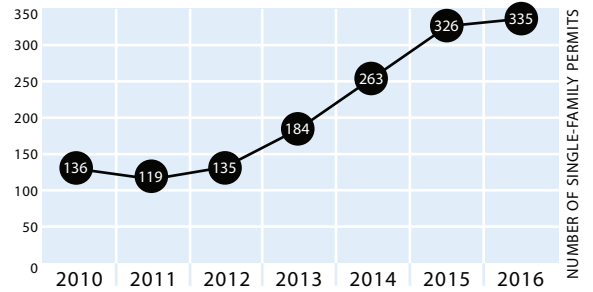
CITY OF WESTFIELD 2Q 2016 NOTABLE EVENTS

- The City unveiled a new bike sharing program for resident and visitors. Zagster cruiser bikes are located on Union Street just south of State Road 32 in downtown and are available for on-demand, local trips for an hourly, monthly or yearly fee.
- A time capsule that contains items donated by community groups, local businesses, and messages to the future submitted by residents was buried in Grand Park. The time capsule will be opened in 30 years.
- Beatification efforts along the US 31 corridor began, paying tribute to the City's founding fathers' guiding principals of peace, responsibility, simplicity, education, honesty and respect, each reflected in a unique color at each of the seven bridges.
- On May 18, Hampton Inn broke ground on their new 90 room hotel located on Wheeler Road just south of State Road 32.

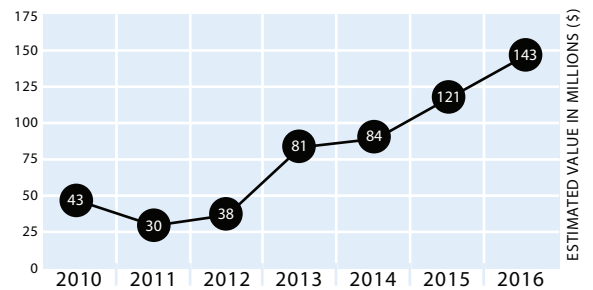
YTD ADVISORY PLAN COMMISSION FILINGS
